Huon Primary will be joining us in Term 4 bringing the number of schools to nine. We now have 90 people on our books with availability fluctuating due to various reasons such as health, travel, paid work and family responsibilities.

Act Belong Commit

In October, we signed on to become an affiliate of Act Belong Commit which is a comprehensive health promotion campaign that encourages individuals to take action to protect and promote their own mental wellbeing and encourages organisations that provide mental health activities.

Free Computer Training for Volunteers

- 80% thought the program has made a considerable contribution to literacy at the school.
- The HU4K program is not yet a strategy in the school literacy plan because it is new but will be in the future.

witnessed the children read to their volunteers. Thank you to Parkfield Primary School for hosting the visit and for the tasty afternoon tea.

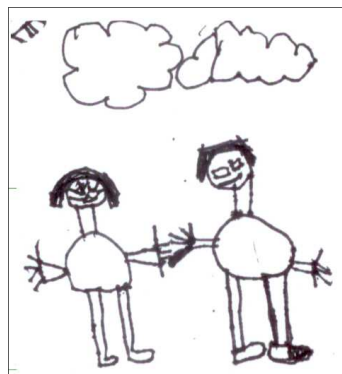
